Health Ethics Trust
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The Health Ethics Trust (HET), a division of the Council of Ethical Organizations, has offered compliance professional certification (Certified Compliance Professional: CCP) since the Trust's inception in 1995. The Council itself has certified compliance professionals since 1988, including healthcare compliance professionals. The goal of the Trust's certification program is to promote professionalism and competence throughout the healthcare compliance community.

The Trust's certification process in overseen by the Education Committee of the Council of Ethical Organizations. This is an independent, voluntary committee of experienced compliance professionals from around the country. Members of this committee oversee changes to the HET certification process as well as reviewing applications for HET certification.

Compliance professionals who wish to complete the certification process must earn a total of 100 points in the identified categories within a three-year period to qualify.

There is an application fee of \$150.00 to process each certification application. This fee is waived for *organizational* members of the Health Ethics Trust. For individual members of the Trust, the application fee is reduced to \$75.00.

COMPLIANCE RELATED EXPERIENCE

- 1. Applicant must have a minimum of 30 points in Part I, Compliance Related Experience.
- 2. Applicant must have a minimum of one-year active compliance-related experience to apply.
- 3. A letter of recommendation from the applicant's sponsor is required. *
- * For example, this could be either the candidate's immediate supervisor or a member of the board committee to which the compliance function reports.

Once an applicant has 90 qualified points, the applicant may request the Essay Examination. The Essay Examination is evaluated on a pass/fail basis by the Education Committee.

- 1. The response to an essay shall not exceed 500 words. Generally, an applicant is asked to answer two questions.
- 2. Topics on this list are examples. Actual questions are selected for each candidate.

Sample Topics.

- 1. As Compliance Officer, describe how your involvement has improved compliance in medical research and/ or the IRB in your organization.
- 2. As Compliance Officer, describe how your involvement has improved compliance with Sarbanes-Oxley or equivalent governance standards.
- 3. What are the pros and cons of emphasizing ethics and values as the cornerstone of your compliance program?
